Ann Burgess, Mien Bible translation coordinator, for 50 years had a special friend and close missionary associate, **Ruth Whitehead**, who died peacefully from heart failure in Ottawa Canada on May 11, 2013 at age 80

Liza Lai and her husband, Andrew, have served among the Mien with Lois & me since late 1980's. Her son, Daniel wrote: "On Wednesday night, (May 15) after a long battle with cancer, my mother, Liza Lai, passed peacefully from this life into the presence of the Lord. ..she was a remarkable woman, the first Christian in her family, and the daughter of immigrants from China to Malaysia .. she loved deeply, prayed fervently, served faithfully, lived simply...Her pride and joy were her grandchildren: Sierra (3), Lilian (2), Drew (2) & Henry (4 months). Memorial Service was held May 26 at Waypointe Christian Fellowship, Richmond CA

**Dorothy Uhlig**, my coworker for 62 years, died in Chiangkham hospital June 25th.

She arrived in Thailand March 30, 1951 as the first new recruit to our small mission staff in Chiangkham. She was a registered nurse and had taken special midwifery training. That was a special blessing to us because in June 1951 she, with Imogene William's assistance, delivered our fourth child, Jeni. Two years later she delivered our youngest child, David. Over the years since then she treated thousands of patients.

During the years our family lived in the Mien mountain village (1952-1960) she and Imogene often purchased and packed supplies and mail to send up to us by Thai carrier. Mel and June Byers also helped often with that chore. All of them visited us there as well as ministering in other mountain and lowland villages.

When the refugee camp near Chiangkham first opened about 1976 the most common ills were malaria and/or pink eye. No doctor had yet arrived at the camp so Dorothy had her clinic staff prepare medicine for those and other ailments in small packets. On Saturdays when her clinic in town was normally closed she and we would go to the camp to distribute the medicine as seemed necessary. Time constraints did not allow for lengthy consultations but hundreds were treated as best as possible each week.

Her Chiangkham "Christian Clinic" became widely known as a place of healing where costs were very minimal. Although she was not an MD she was lovingly and respectfully called "Khun Mor Do-ro-thi" (honorable doctor). Many came to the Lord through that ministry. She went regularly to Ban Sope Waen, which was at first a village for those with leprosy. There she patiently and fearlessly treated the sores on feet, arms, legs of those afflicted. With such care and proper medications the disease itself has been practically eradicated there.

She was constantly involved in the evangelistic work and we

She was much involved in the CYDC dorm for tribal students, the House of Refugee for at risk girls, the Home of Blessing for Hmong students, the area annual Christian conference, and other ministries local and national in Thailand.

She was very well disciplined in all her activities and so humbly and faithfully served wherever she saw a need. I am sure that when I see my Lois again in heaven that Dorothy, Liza, and others we held dear will be nearby.

She would have been 90 years old this Nov. 19<sup>th</sup>.
