### NICK IS WITH JESUS

I want to thank all of you who were praying over the past several months for my son-in-law Nick Nicholson. He went home to the Lord very peacefully on April 1<sup>st</sup>. Nick had severe back pain for much of 2013. No therapy plans were working. On Christmas day Joyce (my oldest daughter) drove from their home in Medford, OR up to Portland with Nick lying on a mat on the floor of the van. That night an MRI at the Veterans’ hospital revealed several tumors up his back. In the following weeks two large tumors and an infected kidney were removed and he had 15 days of radiation. We were hopeful for his recovery. But he developed internal bleeding. He was given 13 pints of blood intravenously over 4 days. But when no cure for the bleeding could be found it became necessary for him to enter hospice care on February 26<sup>th</sup>. The next day I asked him on Skype how he was. “Oh, I’m tired Daddy and want to go see Jesus.” He lingered on for just over a month eating little and steadily growing weaker until he did get to go home to Jesus. He is now free of pain and young again but he will be sadly missed by all of us who knew and loved him.



### BEYOND THE VEIL

This sculpture beautifully portrays the thought expressed in the scripture from Hebrews above. Notice how the old woman is gazing back at the life that she is leaving...then passes through the veil of death into the open arms of the Savior. The "Come Unto Me" bronze sculpture took more than a year to make its first appearance. Unveiled in 2000, the original life-sized bronze monument stands in the grand foyer of the Spilsbury Mortuary in St. George Utah. It has become a scenic attraction, in addition to a comfort to count-less families at a most tender time of their lives. It portrays the spiritual journey from mortality to immortality: an aged woman's body, returning to its prime, and back to the arms of our Savior. Death is not the end. We all have an eternal destiny, as "Come Unto Me" portrays. This scene and explanation has been a comfort to me as I reflect upon Nick's departure. I hope it will comfort and challenge you as you ask yourself, "Am I also safe in the arms of Jesus?"



### NEW GIRLS' DORM

More than 40 years ago Hmong parents came to ask us and our fellow missionaries for a place for their children to stay so they could attend school in Chiang-kham. They cleaned out an old granary then 3 Hmong boys and one Mien stayed there at the beginning. That Mien boy is now Seattle Mien pastor Prasarn Saelee (Yau Fu). To begin with they provided their own food, clothing, books, and school fees. What a difference 40 years has made!
